OPEN NEW DOORS

Painted Door Edges

Place a pop of vibrant, eye-catching color where it's least expected — on the edge of a much-used door.

You'll Need:

Dutch Boy® Cabinet, Door & Trim paint Mini woven roller cover and roller frame Mini trays Painter's tape Screwdriver Fine- to medium-grit sandpaper Drop cloth Clean, damp cloth



Door: Aged Clay 305-5DB Door Edge: Daphne Rose 305-6DB Wall: Perfect Beige 415-4DB Trim: White 003W

Here's How:

- **Step 1** Remove door hardware; use the sandpaper to sand any rough or glossy surfaces on the door edge; wipe with clean, damp cloth to remove dust or debris.
- **Step 2** Lay down the drop cloth to protect floors.
- **Step 3** Affix painter's tape on the front and back of the door, along the edge.
- **Step 4** Using the mini woven roller, paint accent color along the side and top edges of the door.

Optional: Apply a second coat of paint for added coverage.

- **Step 5** Remove the painter's tape while the paint is still damp; allow paint to dry, following suggested drying time on the can label.
- Step 6 Reattach door hardware.
